

-] Reputed professors are invited to conduct/give workshops/lectures about the current and the best practices of research methodologies and Intellectual Property Rights.

The practice:

Problems encountered:

-] Awareness sessions conducted in B.Tech 3rd year left very little amount of time for students to plan and start preparing for careers.
-] Required more elaborate setting for regular orientation to not only students but also parents.
-] It is difficult to plan activities relevant to all categories of students with different abilities and belonged to different section of classes.

Resources required:

-] Need for several seminar halls to plan various sessions simultaneously.
-] Need of more computer labs for practical sessions.
