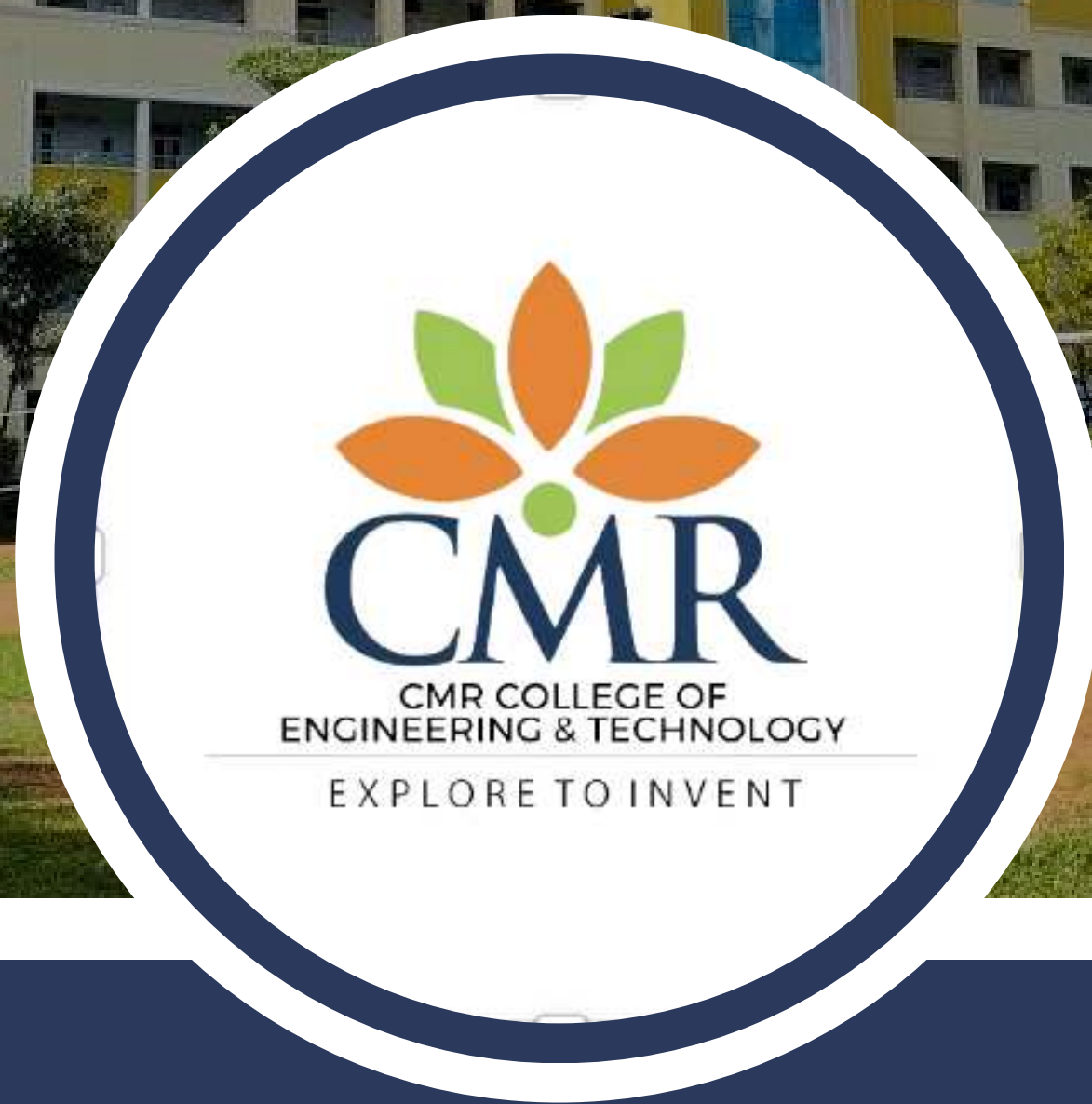

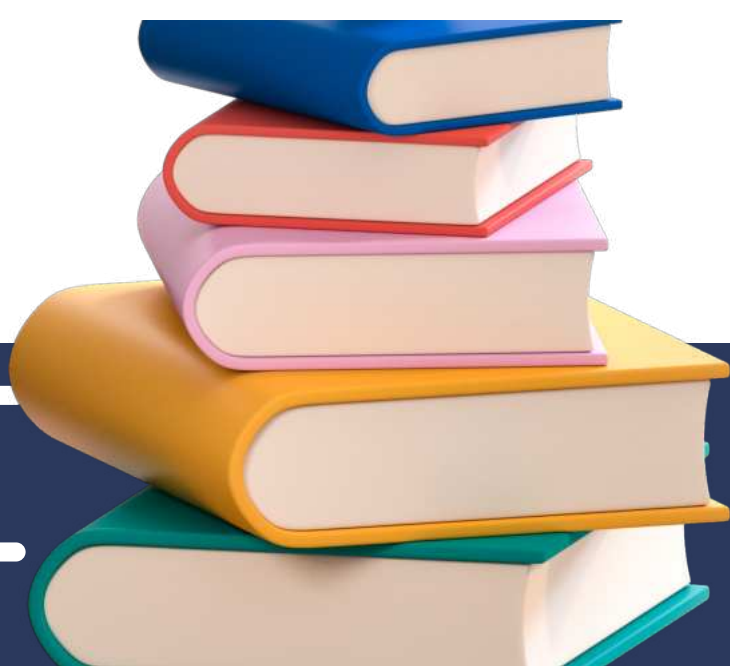

The first technical session was on the topic introduction to machine learning and deep learning and the resource person was Dr. Venkateswara Rao

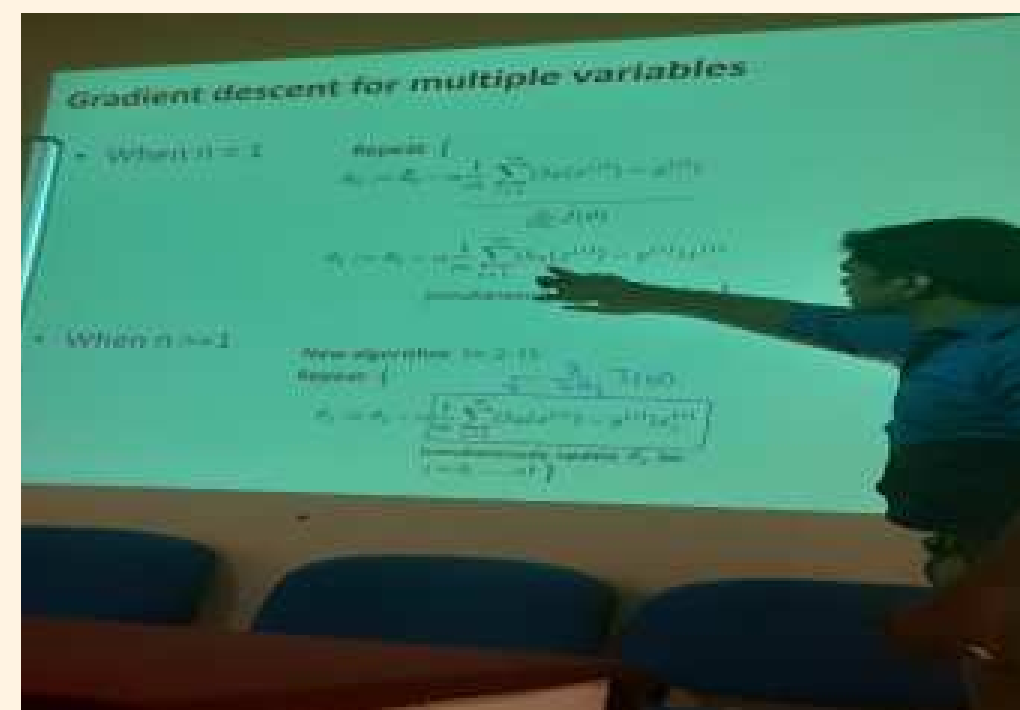


Kagita, Assistant Professor, NIT Warangal. The technical session called regression was followed by lunch.

Meditation, its an often misunderstood word nowadays. If someone sits at a place closing their eyes people refer to them as they are meditating but by closing eyes, one may do Thapa, Japa, or one might have mastered the art of sleeping in vertical postures too. The English word meditation doesn't explain what it is, so let us take the Indian Sanskrit word Dhyana or Dhyanam and try to understand what it exactly refers to.

So, the word Dhyana means to be in the present. The human brain processes about 60,000 to 80,000 thoughts per day, 2500-3,300 thoughts per hour & 50 thoughts per second. Generally, these thoughts are about their past like someone might have behaved in a specific manner or they might have reacted in a particular manner rather than they did at that moment. Or they think about their future to do certain things in a certain manner and so on. So, when all these thoughts compile up one cannot focus on a particular moment & live a full-fledged life. So, Dhyana refers to bringing our thoughts to zero and staying still without any thoughts & doing one thing that he is doing with a whole focus. Meditation is not just a process, it's a quality in itself. It cannot be exactly practiced it can be cultivated by a certain level of practice. Meditation is a state where one doesn't need to sit in a place and close the eyes. Remaining meditative means to be present, which means to nullify all their thoughts and just completely focus on what they are doing at that moment. And that can bring an immense amount of mental peace, well being & it can raise their productivity.

Generally, we humans define ourselves as this physical body & our thoughts. Meditation or Dhyana means to just move a little away from our thoughts & realizing that we are neither the thoughts we generate nor the physical body we possess. This brings an end to most of our suffering. Meditation helps a person to improve their focus, have a greater level of self-control over themselves. Meditation helps us to transcend ourselves into a different level of personality. When a person can do it, that particular person might look like a superhuman to others. But it is not about being superhuman, it is about understanding that being human is super. Meditation has got a great spiritual significance. In spirituality, the ultimate goal is to attain liberation or to come close & become one with nature. Meditation is a process that can take us to that goal. In Spiritual meditation, we calm our mind & focus on the life or energy that is throbbing in our body. And we become receptive to the energy of nature, we become receptive to the grace & thus we move forward towards our goal to attain liberation. While in spiritual meditation we focus on coming close to nature. We become one with nature & taste the essence of the creation. Meditation is a really important practice for students because once they can nullify all their thoughts and focus on what they are doing then they can do miracles in their academics, it reduces many mental issues like anxiety, and depression & it also helps them to deal with negative thoughts very easily. And that's why meditation is recommended for each & every one for its incredible benefits. But it is should always be practiced under the guidance of an experienced practitioner rather than doing it on our own.

Imagine the country you live in being hit by less & less fertile soil, making crop growing increasingly difficult. Sandstorm conditions prevail in the Indian capital & now there are fears of early desertification of the region.

Desertification & Erosion are the concerns that need to be addressed right now. Soil is the habitat on which zillions of life thrive. Because of that thriving life, everything grows. We eat food, animals grow, and everything happens because the soil is rich. Once there is no soil richness, then we have forsaken the planet in many ways.

We talk of emissions, carbon, and pollution at various levels before all that, we need to address the important concern because there is a misunderstanding in the world there are many campaigns to project civic issues as environmental issues. Right now, if plastic bags are floating around your city this is not an ecological issue, this is a civic issue. If our rivers are polluted, this can be fixed in 1 or 2 years if you set up the necessary purification plants & enforce the law, these are civic issues that can be fixed with a little bit of law enforcement & awareness. But the real issue is soil.

The United Nations agencies with enough scientific data are clearly saying that "1/3 rd of world soil is already degraded, only 40-60 years of agricultural soil is left". We are calling this soil extinction. You've heard of dinosaurs going extinct, you've heard of dodos going extinct, but this soil extinction is what we are looking at.

The real problem is soil extinction because, in the last 30 years, 80% of biomass has disappeared from the planet. Journal of Biological Conservation says 6th mass extinction has begun 80% of insect biomass lost in 25-30 years". This is a real suicide.

"World Economic Forum says 30% less food in the next 20-50 years". So, in 45-50 years, there will be a serious food crisis on the planet.

When it happens it's inevitable. When a food crisis comes, whoever has the biggest guns comes & takes the food. The chaos and the suffering that will be created around the world are unimaginable. Don't think only the poor will die.

They will kill the rich & the rich will die. This is not to paint a dark picture. This is the reality that happened many times in human history & once again it's being predicted by the top scientists in the world.

So, what are we going to do? Why is soil becoming extinct in this manner? What is soil becomes sand if we take away all the organic content from it. What is sand becomes soil if we add organic content to it. If you go to a rainforest, the organic content in the soil will be over 70%. In normal agricultural soil, the minimum organic content to be there to call soil is 3%-6%.

But in India for example today in India, 62% of India's soil has less than 0.5%. So, we are on the verge of desertification. This is across the world, not only in one nation.

INTRODUCTION

All registered students of the CMR College of Engineering & Technology can be members of the Student Council. The establishment of student council plays an integral and important role in the student community. Student council provides a representative structure through which students can debate issues of concern and undertake initiatives of benefit to the college and the community. It is important that they be given the opportunity to express their views on issues of concern to them in the college. It is equally important that they are listened to and encouraged to take an active part in promoting the aims and objectives of the college. 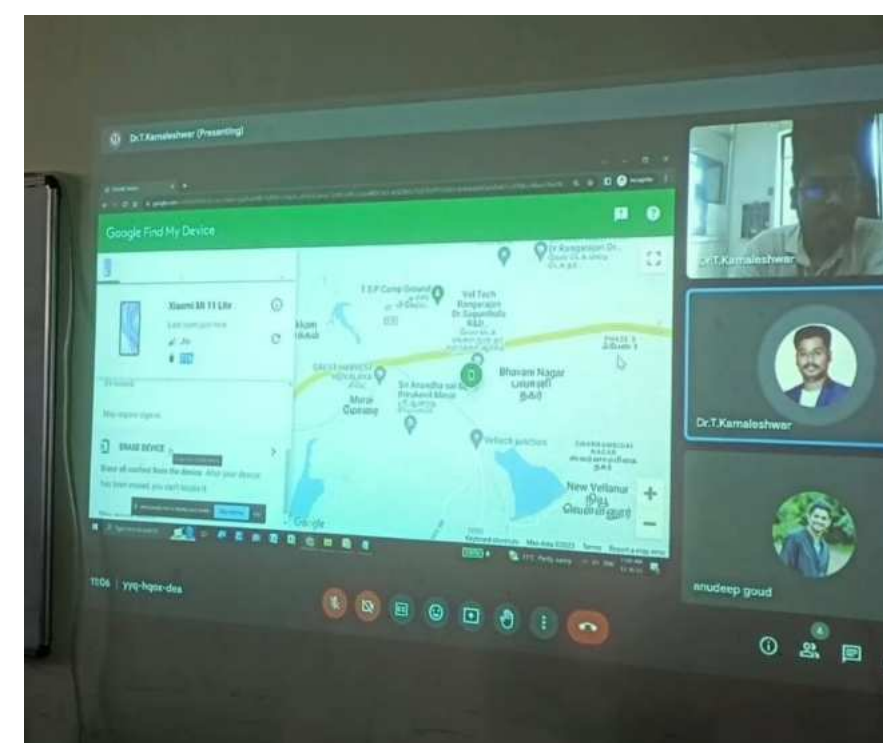

The Story Behind the Telugu SLM 'Chandamama Kathalu'

Small language models, trained on limited datasets and fewer parameters, can revive the lost art of telling stories to children in their native language

Swacha, a Hyderabad-based non-profit organisation, along with its centre software provider Omnetel, has developed a small language model (SLM) for Telugu. Titled 'Chandamama Kathalu' (Chandamama stories), the SLM will be officially launched in the first week of January by Telangana principal IT secretary Jayesh Rajan. This SLM will have 7 to 13 billion parameters.

The genesis of the SLM lies in a paper authored by Microsoft research scientists, titled 'TinyStories'. How small can language models be and still speak coherent English? When Chaitanya Chokkarthy, the chief technology officer of Omnetel, chanced upon this paper, the idea of creating a Telugu SLM took shape in his head.

He collaborated with Swacha Telangana and Intel to build an SLM. To complete the dataset of Telugu stories to build an SLM, he built a Telugu database of stories were manually proofread and corrected by 1,000 students from 30 colleges, who are registered in a database led by Swacha. "I reached out to the secretary of the Free Software Movement of India (which Swacha is a part of), Kiran Chandra Varthana, and asked if we can build a Telugu SLM," he recalled.

Ganesh Karra, secretary, Swacha, said their aim was to give children of today access to the kind of stories that used to appear in the magazine Chandamama Kathalu, which went out of print in 2012. "For example, kids can now play around with the characters of Vikram Betal, which were mainly in these magazines," he said.

By end of November, student volunteers part of Swacha across engineering colleges had built a dataset and assessed if they need separate tokenisers. Tokens are the basic units of text or code that a language model uses to process and generate language. Tokenisers break characters, words, sub-words or other segments into tokens, depending upon the chosen tokenisation method or scheme.

"Microsoft released a paper called 'Tiny Stories' where they trained an SLM using 21 million stories, and it was able to generate coherent text. It was able to generate stories, so that gave us a lot of hope. We thought, if they can do it, why can't we," Chokkarthy said.

A classic Indian monthly magazine for children, Chandamama was a multilingual ALBERT model pre-trained exclusively on 12 major Indian languages. IndicBERT is a multilingual, sequence-to-sequence pre-trained model focusing on Indic languages and English. It currently supports 11 Indian languages and is based on the mBERT architecture. For this, Swacha and Omnetel worked on a dataset of over 150,000 hours of speech and text from about one million people across all 77 districts of India and will be open sourced. At Swacha, several student clubs called GLUG (Google Language User Groups) started working on optical character recognition (OCR) to try to convert handwritten text into digital format. "We were using our own research into what kind of text we are better at, and if we should build an LLM from scratch, and not use Meta's LLaMA2 architecture. For that, we are interacting with IIT," he said.

"We launched this dataset as public in Hyderabad, and the IIT Hyderabad professors came to us and asked if we could collaborate and try to use natural language processing and build our own architecture," he said.

"We're also working with multiple startup companies like Aqube, which has an algorithm for deep learning to build a made-in-India algorithm, and use anything open source," he said.

"I think it will take four or five months before we have our own LLM," he said. But meanwhile, by next week or the week after that, they want to train an open-source LLaMA2 model and allow Telugu stories to be read out or written out. "That's our plan for the next week," he said.
